

**Subject: Revised Passing Criteria, Gracing Rules, and Carry Forward (detention) rules for various UG & PG programs under Choice Based Credit System.**

**Ref.: 1) Notification No. 11/ 2017, dated: 28-02-2017.  
2) SPU / CBCS /181 B/2018, dated: 26-03-2018.**

It is hereby notified that Passing Criteria, Gracing rules, and Carry Forward (detention) rules for various UG & PG programs under Choice Based Credit System as mentioned in the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Regulation 2016-17 of Sankalchand Patel University, stands amended as under effective from the batch of first year students admitted in academic year 2018-19 onwards;

i. Passing Criteria for UG & PG Programs

- To successfully pass each subject a student has to secure an aggregate score of minimum 40% marks combined in University assessment/evaluation, and Continuous assessment/evaluation components, but separately for Theory as well as Practical examination.
- Absent in any evaluation component of the subject shall be treated as fail in spite of 40% or more aggregate marks in other components.

ii. Gracing Rules

From existing Gracing Rules as indicated in SPU CBCS Regulations, following gracing rules shall not be applicable hence they shall be omitted from the regulations, and regulations shall be amended appropriately.

iii. Carry Forward (Detention) Rules

For Academic Progression to Higher Semester the following rules shall replace the existing Backlogs and Promotion (Detention Rule) norms of SPU CBCS Regulations.

The revised rules shall be placed as follows:





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- A student must have to display good conduct and disciplined behavior for academic progression to higher semesters.
- A student is expected to have 100% attendance in all components of the course. However, a leave of absence of not more than 25% may be granted for unavoidable circumstances by the Principal or the person authorized by Principal in this regard.
- If a student remains absent from the university evaluation examination of consecutive Two semesters; he /she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of higher semesters.
- A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of I, II, and III semesters till the IV semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of V semester until all the courses of I and II semesters are successfully completed.
- A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of III, IV, and V semesters till the VI semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of VII semester until all the courses of I, II, III and IV semesters are successfully completed.
- Similar modus operandi shall be applied for those programs having more semesters of study.
